If you were not able to have your photo taken in May, there is still time. You may submit a photo directly to the church office, and we will include it in the directory.

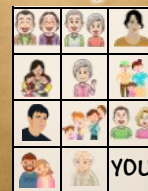
All members, friends, and attendees of the church are welcome to be part of the directory. It's a wonderful way to help us stay connected as one church family.

## From the Roost

# Pictures in a Garage

"Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, the people he chose for his inheritance."

– Psalm 33:12

Ahoy,

When I was a little boy two portraits hung on the inside front of my parents' garage, visible each time the car pulled into its spot. The portraits were of George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. As I write this, Memorial Day weekend is nearly here. June has Flag Day. July has Independence Day. It's a big swath of the calendar that reminds us of our national legacy. When an elementary school was being sold, parts of it were given away. That's how Mom and Dad ended up with the portraits. There was a time when classrooms, school offices and other government offices typically had pictures of these two men. Presidents used to have the portraits behind them for televised addresses until presidential handlers advised against it, figuring any current president would look insignificant in comparison to GW and AL.

The idea exists that the 1700's, especially the Revolutionary War, was like our nation's Old Testament times. Washington is compared to Moses, because he led his people (Americans) to a new land, a new nation. Of course in Washington's case this didn't involve travel to another place. The land was the same. It became a new place as a new nation, gaining independence from a great colonial power through hard suffering.

The 1800's, especially the Civil War, is, this idea continues, like our country's New Testament. When Lincoln said, "A house divided against itself cannot stand," he was quoting Jesus (Matthew 12:25). At that time most people knew that, being far more biblically literate than folks are now. Lincoln talked about God a great deal. Lincoln also said repeatedly that he belonged to no specific religion, no particular creed. It's ironic, then, that the re-uniting, the saving of our nation through the Civil War led to the comparison between the 16<sup>th</sup> President and Our Savior. Lincoln was killed Friday, April 14, 1865. It wasn't just any Friday. It was Good Friday. Two days later many Easter Sunday sermons talked about how, through the life and sacrifice of Abraham Lincoln, our nation was resurrected; the US came back to life after being split by several states' successions.

Washington wasn't Moses. Lincoln wasn't Jesus. The USA isn't the Promised Land. The Ultimate Promised Land is God's Coming Kingdom. On the other hand, maybe these comparisons can be helpful and useful as long as we don't push them too far. The comparisons connect US history and the Bible so that the one can remind us of the other (either way), which makes the comparisons interesting tools for teaching and learning.

Too many people in this country today seem to know far too little about the Bible or US history. If we forget about the past we'll mess up the future. Let us instead claim and study and continue to try to understand our heritage, as Christians and as Americans. By doing so we might be able to better share and spread . . .

## Teaching Moments: James the Epistle writer

James, often referred to as James the Just, is a significant figure in early Christianity and is traditionally recognized as the brother of Jesus Christ. He is distinct from James the son of Zebedee and James the son of Alphaeus, both of whom were among the Twelve Apostles. James, the brother of Jesus, played a crucial role in the Jerusalem church and is noted for his leadership, wisdom, and piety.

James emerged as a prominent leader in the early Christian community in Jerusalem. His leadership is evident in the Acts of the Apostles and the writings of Paul. In Acts 15, during the Council of Jerusalem, James plays a pivotal role in addressing the issue of Gentile converts and the requirements of the Mosaic Law. Acts 15:13-19 records James' speech, where he supports the decision that Gentile believers should not be burdened with the full yoke of the Law, emphasizing instead a few essential practices.

James' writing reflects a deep concern for ethical conduct, social justice, and the proper use of speech. His teachings on patience, prayer, and humility have been influential in Christian thought and practice.

## Think Green - Recycling

FiCUMC has several recycling programs to help care for God's creation — and we'd love your participation. Bring the following items to the church so they can be kept out of landfills and properly recycled.

Recycling containers are located beside the counter near the Second Street main entrance.



- **Metal Recycling:** Our metal recycling ended as we no longer have the leadership to continue metal recycling within our community. We are continuing to **recycle aluminum** and **steel cans** within the church -- **MUST BE CLEANED/RINSED** -- and small items.

- **Paper:** Please place bulletins and other paper in a **blue** recycling **container** for recycling.
- **Aluminum Cans Pull-Tabs:** We take them to the **Ronald McDonald House** in Hershey.
- **Empty Printer Cartridges:** We recycle toner and inkjet cartridges. These are taken to **Staples**, where the church receives reward points that can be used toward future purchases.
- **Rechargeable and single-use batteries:** All batteries collected will be taken to **Newcomer's** for recycling.

The **2026 Altar Flowers Chart** is posted on the bulletin board at the Second Street entrance (near Frank Hall). To sponsor flowers, simply check the chart for available dates and write your information directly on it. A yellow **“How To” guide** is posted beside the chart to help with the process.

### Guidelines for Sponsoring/Ordering Flowers

- You may order flowers from the florist of your choice. Most local florists are familiar with our building and can deliver on Saturday.
- Payment is made directly to the florist; the church does not handle these transactions.
- Flowers may be placed in the church’s **two brass vases with liners** (available to florists on Monday), **OR** delivered in a **self-contained arrangement** (*easy to take home or share*).
  - *The brass vases remain at the church. “Juice cans” are provided for taking flowers home.*
- Flowers should be picked up by sponsoring persons/families by **noon on Monday**. Remaining flowers will be delivered to hospital patients and/or shut-ins.
- For bulletin wording (“in memory of” / “in honor of”), please **write your information on the chart** or contact the **Altar Guild / Church Office (717-762-7042)** at least **two weeks in advance**.
