April 3 – Good Friday at 7:00 PM

A solemn time of reflection as we remember the crucifixion and the depth of Christ's sacrifice.

April 5 – Easter Sunday at 8:15 AM & 10:45 AM

Rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus Christ — the foundation of our faith and the promise of hope, renewal, and new beginnings.

As we move through this meaningful season, we look forward to worshiping, learning, and growing alongside you. Your presence and prayers enrich our community, and together we lift one another up on this Lenten journey.

Church Merger Updates: Moving Forward Together

As we move toward March and settle into the season of Lent — with Ash Wednesday now behind us — we continue growing into our shared life as **Faith in Christ United Methodist Church**. Lent invites us to slow down, reflect, and open ourselves to God's work of shaping and steadying us. It is a fitting season for the practical and spiritual work of becoming one congregation, and each week brings signs of progress as we learn to live into this new beginning.



On the administrative side, we are moving steadily forward. We have our new EIN, and all of our bank accounts have been created and are fully able to be used; the only remaining step is finalizing online access. Our goal is to be fully transitioned to all Faith in Christ UMC accounts as soon as possible, and no later than the end of the first quarter. The FiCUMC Ministry Funds account is active and already now being used for all operations and ministry income and expenses of the newly merged church. All checks should now be made payable to Faith in Christ UMC.

Members should **not** need the new EIN for their personal bank. To ensure contributions are processed correctly, donors should only need to update: The **new church name**: *Faith in Christ UMC*
If you need our new EIN, please contact the Church Office.

As we continue through Lent, we are reminded that God often works in seasons of transition — guiding us, preparing us, and calling us to trust the path ahead. Even as we navigate the administrative steps of becoming one church family, we do so with hope, patience, and confidence in God's leading.

Please keep our leaders, committees, and one another in prayer as we continue this work together. May we move forward with open hearts, trusting that God is shaping a faithful and unified future for us.

From the Roost

Knowing About God

“For as I walked around and looked carefully at your objects of worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. Now what you worship as something unknown I am going to proclaim to you.”

-Paul of Tarsus, Acts 17:23 NIV

The month of March was named after Mars, the Roman God of War, known in Greek as Ares. Areopagus, meaning “Hill of Mars,” is a low, rocky hill in Athens, Greece. In ancient times a court of nobles convened there.

Acts 17:16-34 tells what happened when the Apostle Paul was on Areopagus. Paul went there at the request of philosophers who wanted to hear more of his teachings. He saw an altar with the inscription TO AN UNKNOWN GOD. Paul began to tell them what he knew about God. Some people scoffed at him but others, including a man, Dionysius and a woman, Damaris, became Christians.

This March contains the majority of Lent for 2026. Lent is a very important time of the year in the Christian calendar. As you consider these holy days in Lent think about what they reveal about the Divine. What does Ash Wednesday (*death, repentance*) tell us about God? What does Palm Sunday (*donkey, triumphal Jerusalem entry*) tell us about God? What does Maundy Thursday (*communion, love one another*) tell us about God? What does Good Friday (*crucifixion, salvation to believers*) tell us about God? What does Easter Sunday (*resurrection, death not final*) tell us about God? Our God is not unknown. Certainly we cannot fully comprehend God; our heads might explode! God has revealed more than enough, however, for us to live holy lives.

We believe in and follow the God that Paul knew and taught. When you are making an important decision in your life, or even a not-quite-crucial decision, ask yourself, “What do I know about God?” Your knowledge of God (theology) should affect how you think, feel and act (ethics). That which God has revealed about the Father, Son and Holy Spirit needs to be the basis of how we live our lives. May your lives be filled with . . .

Teaching Moment: Jude

Jude Thaddeus is one of those fascinating figures in Scripture who often slips past us—yet the more we look, the more compelling he becomes. Known by several names in the New Testament (Jude of James, Judas Thaddaeus, and Lebbaeus), he stands among the Twelve Apostles as a steady, faithful presence, though less prominent than figures like Peter and John. And importantly, he is not to be confused with Judas Iscariot.

Some early traditions even suggest Jude may have been a brother of Jesus, though scholars continue to debate that connection. What we do know is that he appears in the apostolic lists and, though not as prominent as Peter or John, his influence reaches farther than his brief mentions might suggest.

Jude is traditionally credited with writing the Epistle of Jude — a short but powerful letter urging believers to stay grounded in their faith and alert to false teachings. It emphasizes the importance of perseverance in the face of challenges that still resonates deeply today.

According to Christian tradition, Jude carried the Gospel far and wide — through Judea and Samaria, and possibly as far as Armenia, where he is believed to have been martyred. His relics are said to rest in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, honored alongside St. Simon the Zealot.

Jude's story invites us to look again at the quieter apostles— those whose steady faith helped form the early church and continues to inspire us.

We give thanks for the life and ministry of **John Angle**, who faithfully served our congregation as organist and shared his musical gifts with such grace. A **Celebration of Life** service will be held on **Sunday, March 15 at 2 PM** at **Evangelical Lutheran Church on Washington Street in Greencastle**. All who knew John, worshiped with him, or were blessed by his music are invited to attend as we remember his life and commend him to God's eternal care.

Think Green - Recycling

FiCUMC has several recycling programs to help care for God’s creation — and we’d love your participation. Bring the following items to the church so they can be kept out of landfills and properly recycled. Recycling containers are located beside the counter near the Second Street entrance to Frank Hall.

- **Metal Recycling:** Our metal recycling ended as we no longer have the leadership to continue metal recycling within our community. We are continuing to **recycle aluminum** and **steel cans** within the church -- **MUST BE CLEANED/RINSED** -- and small items.
- **Aluminum Cans Pull-Tabs:** We take them to the **Ronald McDonald House** in Hershey.
- **Paper:** Please place bulletins and other paper in a **blue recycling container** for recycling.

- **Empty Printer Cartridges:** We recycle toner and inkjet cartridges.
- **Rechargeable and single-use batteries:** Batteries will be taken for recycling.

Attendance and Offering Report

FiCUMC Monthly and Year-to-Date Financial Updates

We are in the process of transitioning completely to our new bank accounts. At the same time, our Ministry Funds treasurer, Beverly, has begun working with an updated version of Quicken, replacing the 2011 software we had been using. She is still getting acquainted with the new system and is entering our 2026 budget and creating the financial reports we use. These tasks, along with transferring historical data from the old software to the new setup on a different computer, have added extra work and are taking additional time, but the process is moving forward steadily.

Because January transactions — and a few early-February stragglers — were split between old and new accounts and between old and new software during the transition, the reporting process has been more complex than usual. This overlap, combined with end-of-year closing, the start of a new fiscal year, and additional merger-related responsibilities, has made it challenging to produce complete and accurate financial reports by press time.

We expect to have full reports ready soon, and they will be included in next month's newsletter.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we work through these important transitions with care and accuracy.

ALTAR FLOWERS

The flowers on the altar are presented to the Glory of God ... *(all Sundays - Open)*



Sponsoring Altar Flowers is a meaningful way to give thanks to God for someone special in your life —past or present. **Dedications and remembrances** will be acknowledged in the Sunday bulletin and monthly newsletter (if received in time). The **2026 Altar Flowers Chart** is posted on the bulletin board at the Second Street entrance (near Frank Hall). To sponsor flowers, simply check the chart for available dates and write your information directly on it. A yellow **"How To"** guide is posted beside the chart to help with the process.

Guidelines for Sponsoring/Ordering Flowers

- You may order flowers from the florist of your choice. Most local florists are familiar with our building and can deliver on Saturday.
- Payment is made directly to the florist; the church does not handle these transactions.
- Flowers may be placed in the church's **two brass vases with liners** (available to florists on Monday), **OR** delivered in a **self-contained arrangement**.
 - The brass vases remain at the church. "Juice cans" are provided for taking flowers home.*
 - Self-contained arrangements are easy to take home or share.*
- Flowers should be picked up by sponsoring persons/families by **noon on Monday**. Remaining flowers will be delivered to hospital patients and/or shut-ins.
- For bulletin wording ("in memory of" / "in honor of"), please **write your information on the chart** or contact the **Altar Guild / Church Office (717-762-7042)** at least **two weeks in advance**.

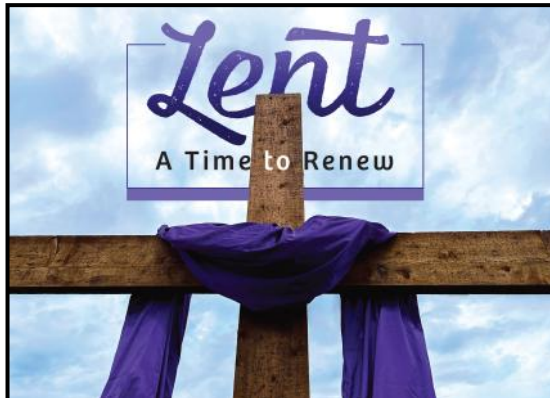
