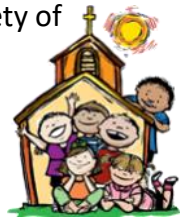


Nursery and Camp Sunshine (children's church program) **are offered at the 10:45 service.**

From the Roost

Remix

Psalm 85:6: "Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?"

Revival is an important part of the Christian religion. Historically, large revivals have taken place in the United States, including The Great Awakening (1730's - 1740's) and the Second Great Awakening (1790's - 1850's). From www.crossroads.net come two very good definitions. "Revival is the act or process of bringing something back to life, consciousness, or strength." Relating to religion, revival "Refers to a renewed spiritual interest, awakening, or the rejuvenation of a faith community. It often involves heightened prayer, repentance, and evangelism."

The kind of revival congregations and denominations need today is a Remix. A remix, in music, is when people take a song from years ago and change it, adding a beat or spacing the notes out differently or using different instruments and so forth. The song is essentially the same but the presentation is different. The style of preaching and music that worked so well in the 1850's and 1950's will not work today. Times and people have changed. The Gospel message and God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, remain the same. How God and the Gospel message need to be presented in a way that touches the hearts and evokes interest in the minds of the younger generations today, so that more people are committed to morality and serving others as God desires, that has changed.

If the music and preaching were repeated verbatim from what was done in the rural areas in the 1850's, that would be an interesting historical curiosity, but not an effective means of outreach. Let us do our part of reaching out to young people today with Christ's love. Sharing the Gospel message: absolutely. Revival: absolutely. It needs to be a type of revival that is a Remix, effectively sharing today God's . . .

Think Green - Recycling

FiCUMC has several recycling programs to help care for God's creation — and we'd love your participation. Bring the following items to the church so they can be kept out of landfills and properly recycled. Recycling containers are located beside the counter near the Second Street main entrance.



- **Metal Recycling:** Our metal recycling ended as we no longer have the leadership to continue metal recycling within our community. We are continuing to **recycle aluminum and steel cans** within the church -- **MUST BE CLEANED/RINSED** -- and small items.
- **Paper:** Please place bulletins and other paper in a **blue** recycling **container** for recycling.
- **Aluminum Cans Pull-Tabs:** We take them to the **Ronald McDonald House** in Hershey.
- **Empty Printer Cartridges:** We recycle toner and inkjet cartridges. These are taken to *Staples*, where the church receives reward points that can be used toward future purchases.

When Care Matters Most

Because hospitals no longer notify churches and privacy laws limit what staff can share, we rely on you or someone close to you to let us know when pastoral care is needed. At FiCUMC, we offer immediate food support to neighbors in need — sharing Christ's love in action. Through **Susanna's Pantry**, we provide groceries to Waynesboro community members who come seeking help. This ministry is rooted in faith, trusting that God will continue to provide as we share with others.

You can make a difference! Donations of non-perishable, easy-to-prepare items are especially appreciated. Sponsoring Altar Flowers is a meaningful way to give thanks to God for someone special in your life — past or present. **Dedications and remembrances** will be acknowledged in the Sunday bulletin and monthly newsletter (if received in time). The **2026 Altar Flowers Chart** is posted on the bulletin board at the Second Street entrance (near Frank Hall). To sponsor flowers, simply check the chart for available dates and write your information directly on it. A yellow **"How To" guide** is posted beside the chart to help with the process.

Guidelines for Sponsoring/Ordering Flowers

- You may order flowers from the florist of your choice.
Most local florists are familiar with our building and can deliver on Saturday.
- Payment is made directly to the florist; the church does not handle these transactions.
- Flowers may be placed in the church's **two brass vases with liners** (available to florists on Monday), **OR** delivered in a **self-contained arrangement** (*easy to take home or share*).
 - The brass vases remain at the church. "Juice cans" are provided for taking flowers home.*
- Flowers should be picked up by sponsoring persons/families by **noon on Monday**.
Remaining flowers will be delivered to hospital patients and/or shut-ins.
- For bulletin wording ("in memory of" / "in honor of"), please **write your information on the chart** or contact the **Altar Guild / Church Office (717-762-7042)** at least **two weeks in advance**.
